

Citizens Advice Supporting Residents through Crisis





IN THE GARDEN

Here at Pettals Cottage the weeks of rain and warm temperatures have made for an abundant and lush garden. Several plants have performed especially well and I'm particularly enjoying the fuchsias. I bought several young fuchsia plants at our club meeting in May, supplied by speaker Derek Dexter. The plants are flowering non-stop and I hope other members have enjoyed success with their plants and discovered new varieties. My fuchsia Gillian Althea, has enormous double magenta and deep purple flowers. It's a stunner, if a little exuberant, with flowers larger than hens' eggs. It daily makes me smile every day.

This year I've moved to using peat free compost, to help with the preservation of precious peat bogs and for the wider environment. I've had a few teething problems that are to be expected but the most frustrating is to find the compost is not weed-free. Within a week or two of use a heavy crop of weed seedlings pop up. I used a proprietary brand bought from a garden centre and had hoped for better. I'll try another brand next season and keep my fingers crossed. I hope you've had better results.

Did any other members take the advise of the speaker at our spring shopping visit to the Gardens Group Castle Gardens and try planting Bidens in garden tubs? Bidens ferny foliage is topped with abundant colourful blooms and are a delight that require little attention. These are going to be a staple of our summer planters next year. An excellent find that I recommend for informal, cottage planting. The Garden Group shopping evenings for club members are a great source of horticultural knowledge, current retail trends as well as offering a generous discount on shopping. A super opportunity.

It will soon be time for planting Spring flowering bulbs. Happy gardening days!

TRAFFIC IN THE PIDDLE VALLEY

There have been some recent discussions in previous publications of the Piddle Valley News and Views regarding a 20 mph speed limit through the valley to replace the existing 30 mph speed limit. As a result, we undertook a survey of residents within the wider White Lackington area (Mistover to Banks Cottages) to assess the desire for further speed restrictions within the valley as well as other measures to improve safety on roads within the valley. The results of this survey are provided here.

Questionnaires delivered = 50 Responses received/collected = 38 (76% response)

If feasible, would you like to see the current 30 mph speed limit replaced with a 20 mph speed limit throughout the valley?

Yes = 39%, No = 61%

If 20 mph applied only to certain areas, which of these areas do you consider should be assigned as a 20 mph speed limit?

Rectory Road: Yes = 77%, No = 23%

Piddlehinton High Street: Yes = 74%, No = 26%

White Lackington: Yes = 77%, No = 23% Outside the School: Yes = 91%, No = 9%

Alongside the old shop/village hall Yes = 60%, No = 40%

Alongside The Poachers/Plush Road: Yes = 34%, No = 66%

Church Lane end of Piddletrenthide: Yes = 49%, No = 51%

Any others: London Row

Would you walk/cycle/ride more regularly if the speed limit was lowered?

Yes = 61%, No = 39%

What other measures would you like to see implemented to improve road safety within the valley?

Flashing speed reminders: Yes = 76%, No = 24%

Improved signage: Yes = 69%, No = 31%

Chicane: Yes = 29%, No = 71%

Strategic road narrowing: Yes = 38%, No = 62%

Zebra crossing outside school: Yes = 56%, No = 44%

Any others:

Increased Community Speed Watch.

Concealed entrance signs at either end of the two White Lackington turns or warning of narrow road.

Give way to oncoming traffic between South View and the European. Weight and size limits except for access.

Definitely NO speed bumps.

Some observations which we have made through this process:

- Response was relatively good but only reflects the views of the residents of the wider area of White Lackington.
- Not all of the speed limitations or other measures identified may be feasible.
- The majority of residents would not want (61%) the current 30 mph speed limit replaced with a 20 mph limit throughout the valley. However, there was a desire for a 20 mph speed limit within Piddlehinton, White Lackington to beyond the school in Piddletrenthide.
- There was a preference for improved signage along the length of the valley road whether by an increase in flashing speed reminders, signage or road markings. Chicanes and narrowing of roads to reduce speeds were less popular options.

Next steps

The survey could be rolled out to other villages in the valley if there are residents willing to volunteer to drop questionnaires and collect responses.

As a result of the feedback so far, more volunteers are being trained for the Community Speed Watch and there will be an increase in speed checks.

PIDDLEHINTON GYM RENOVATIONS

- Electrical recommendation and improvements, including new solar lights, fire alarms and improved emergency lighting.
- Refurbished Gym equipment, including repainted Badminton stands.
- Gutters and drains cleared out, tidy up and clean inside and out.
- Pended is 100mb/s Wessex Internet Fibre for Gym users.
- A sprung wood floor cleaned many, many times!



THE ALTON PANCRAS TRUST

The Alton Pancras Trust has been operational in its current format since 1989. It is registered with the Charity Commission under charity number 800977.

Trust Objectives

To promote such charitable purposes for the benefit of the inhabitants of Alton Pancras in the county of Dorset and the immediate vicinity as the Trustees shall from time to time think fit.

The official wording of the Trust Deed (above) has been interpreted by the Trustees to cover grants for the following:

- Small projects for the general benefit of the village of Alton Pancras.
- Personal grants or loans for educational or social purposes.
- Alleviation of hardship following illness or injury.

Examples of recent grants provided include:

- Substantial contribution to the cost of the Millennium Bench at Burnt House Bottom, and to its subsequent maintenance.
- Matching village contributions towards the cost of railings along the river through the village.
- Supporting the Village Map and The Village History projects.
- Funding the establishment and ongoing costs of the Wildlife Area in the water meadow.
- Purchasing marquees and tents for use of the village, particularly for the annual village fete.
- Funding a permanent store for village assets including marquees and tents, fete equipment, and Church equipment.

The Trustees also agreed to buy each child living in the village, aged under 18 years old on 2 June 2022, a memento of the Platinum Jubilee.

Applications

Any resident of Alton Pancras may propose a use for Trust funds which are in keeping with the Alton Pancras Trust's defined objectives.

Any such proposals, and any applications for assistance from individuals, which may be made in confidence, can be made to any of

the Trustees, and all proposals and applications will be considered by the Board of Trustees at its next full meeting.

Winter vaccination programme

We are currently working hard planning our Winter Vaccination Programme, due to start in September 2023. Clinics will be available to book online or by phone from Monday 4th September 2023 after 10am. Clinic dates are listed below and will also be advertised in all the usual places, our website www.puddletownsurgery, our surgery newsletter

and on Facebook.

If you are aware of a neighbour who may not have access to this information, please do share it.

The below groups will be eligible for a flu vaccine:

- those aged 65 years and over.
- those aged 6 months to under 65 years in clinical risk groups.
- pregnant women
- all children aged 2 or 3 years on 31 August 2023
- primary school aged children, from Reception to Year 6. (School age children with underlying health conditions can have their vaccination with the GP rather than waiting for the school vaccination programme).
- carers in receipt of carer's allowance, or those who are the main carer of an elderly or disabled person.
 - close contacts of immunocompromised individuals
- frontline workers in a social care setting without an employer led occupational health scheme including those working for a registered residential care or nursing home, registered domiciliary care providers, voluntary managed hospice providers and those that are employed by those who receive direct payments (personal budgets) or Personal Health budgets, such as Personal Assistants

This year's programme does NOT include those aged 50-64 that are not in an at-risk group.



WHAT TO LOOK OUT FOR IN THE NIGHT SKY: JULY/AUGUST

The chart below shows the whole night sky as it'll appear at 10pm on October 1st (south at the bottom, north at the top, directly overhead in the middle). You can see that the Milky Way arcs through the whole sky, from Northwest to southeast. The chart also shows Saturn nicely placed for observation to the south and Jupiter rising in the east.

The constellation Taurus is also rising in the east, with the Pleiades (the so-called 'Herald of Winter') already well established in the night sky.

The Draconids meteor shower peaks on the 8/9th of October, and features an hourly meteor rate of around 10 per hour.
